

Julietta Winston One Year Later

ROCKVILLE - Exactly one year ago today on December 19th 1997 Julietta Winston was found dead in her apartment. Her death was ruled a homicide by the Rockville Police. It was very early on a Saturday morning roughly around 3am in Rockville when police got the 911 call for a woman found unresponsive in her apartment. The call came in from her then boyfriend Johnny Bardove. According to Mr. Bardove he was not with Winston at the time of her death which was ruled to be a few hours earlier at around 11p. The autopsy report shows that Winston's body had significant blunt forced trauma to her head which played a role in her death along with asphyxiation. Her boyfriend Johnny Bardove has not yet been ruled out as a suspect and is still a person of interest. Police say they have ruled out many of the possible suspects but they do have other persons of interest on the list they are still looking into.

Missing Man Found

The National Park Service said they believe they have found the body of a missing Ohio man in the Grand Canyon. National Park Service personnel located a man's body and motorcycle Wednesday below the South Kaibab Trailhead of the Grand Canyon after a multi-day search, officials said in a statement. Officials said the person is believed to be John Williamson, 40, of Cleveland Ohio. Williamson has been missing since Nov. 23. The identification was based on evidence found with the body. Bill Clinton to Testify

President Bill Clinton pledged yesterday to testify "completely and truthfully" about his relationship with Monica S. Lewinsky, but said he will offer no public explanation before he submits to questioning under oath by independent counsel Kenneth W. Starr in two weeks. As Starr's investigation moves quickly toward a possible conclusion, Clinton briefly broke his long silence on the inquiry to say he was eager to put the matter behind him. He did not, however, repeat past denials of allegations that he had a sexual affair with Lewinsky and encouraged her to lie about it during the Paula Jones lawsuit.

"No one wants to get this matter behind us more than I do -- except maybe all the rest of the American people," the president said. "I am looking forward to the opportunity in the next few days of testifying. I will do so completely and truthfully. I am anxious to do it. But I hope you can understand why, in the interim, I can and should have no further comment on these matters." After being subpoenaed by Starr, Clinton agreed this week to testify on Aug. 17 at the White House, the first time a president ever will be interrogated in a grand jury investigation of his conduct. While his attorney David E. Kendall said Wednesday that the session would be videotaped, in fact it will be fully recorded.

ROCKVILLE - Max, the adorable brown Pitbull, didn't get the memo that the swimming pool was closed for the season. Max was chasing his brother around the pool, enjoying the snow, when he went paws-first straight into the pool. Navia says that Max was under the water for almost a full minute. When she was finally able to hoist him out of the freezing water, she called her neighbor, a veterinarian, who administered an emergency shot. "She said, 'If we wouldn't have given him that, I don't think he would've made it,'" Tatum explained. Navia Tatum said she had the pool installed early this year after winning it big in the December 19th lottery exactly one year ago. Navia was the sole winner of the 5 Million Dollar Jackpot.
